A review of online university guidance – what is the future?

At UniTasterDays we asked secondary school and college colleagues about their experience of online and in-person university events during the 20-21 academic year - and the university guidance they foresee during the year ahead. It was completed by colleagues who:

- 1. organised university events
- 2. had an awareness of the university events offered or
- considered themselves the most appropriate colleague in their institution to complete the survey.

Key background facts:

- **122** responses were received during July 2021, of which the majority **(72%)** were from a non-fee paying school or college.
- **89%** of respondents were from a school or college teaching students at post-16 level.
- **93%** of respondents were in England, with the remainder in Northern Ireland and Wales.
- Most respondents (73%) undertook university guidance because the majority of their students wanted to go to university – so the information supported their students to make informed decisions.

Access and Technology whilst in school

From September, it appears schools will be more interested in on-campus provision than online. Whilst answers for 'No preference' are relevant, if they are removed, the percentage for schools preferring in-person activity increases to 77%.
